### December Open House brings new stories about Mendon

On December  $14^{\rm th}$  and  $15^{\rm th}$  the Mendon Historical Society opened its doors for the first time to the public. The soft opening at our new location, 15 Hastings Street, highlighted four aspects of the history of Mendon. Exhibits included Southwicks Zoo, the Dairy Industry in Mendon, the Life and Work of Artist Doris Daniels Cox and ladies Fashion and Lifestyle.

The exhibits were made possible through the help of many volunteers. Justine Brewer brought to light the history of Southwick's Zoo in Mendon. Her display included old photographs and memorabilia as well as a 1934 Going Away Outfit of Clarice Daniels Southwick - Founder of Southwick's Zoo.

Carleton Cox made the long trip from Pennsylvania to display several of his mother's paintings for the open house. In addition he generously donated prints and note card sets to the Museum. All proceeds of the sale of these items will be donated to the society. Carleton prepared a written history of Doris' career as an artist and the contributions she made in establishing the Blackstone Valley Art Association.

Members of the society worked to collect artifacts and stories on the history of the Dairy Industry in Mendon. On display were bottles, photographs, documents and tools associated with the production of milk products. A map of the local dairies was created as well. Many visitors came with stories of what they remember of the local dairies and farmers in Mendon. Patrice Doucette donated several dairy related items to the museum and shared the research done by her late husband Paul Doucette who was an avid collector of milk bottles and history in general. David Lowell donated the ice cream flavors sign from Lowell's Dairy.

Sue Ober and Arlene Reed spent countless hours preparing the Parlor Room to display artifacts in the collection relating to ladies fashion and lifestyles. Spanning over two hundred years the items in this collection tell the story of women in the community and their differing roles and skills. A 325th Anniversary quilt was displayed in the parlor room featuring the stitched signatures of many prominent Mendon residents including familiar names like Clough, Thayer, Wood, Taft, Davenport, Lowell and many more!

The two-day opening brought in many people who shared new stories and memories of growing up in Mendon. It is the hope of the society that we can continue to build on these stories and document them for future generations to enjoy. We are thankful for all those who attended and hope you will visit again soon.

Members of the Mendon Historical Society and the Historical Commission have been invited to participate in the Community Partnership Project with faculty and staff at Nipmuc Regional High School.

This program is designed to bring in real life learning experiences to the student population. By partnering with community organizations the students have the opportunity to see how their education is relevant in the real world.

We are excited to have this chance to share ideas with students and find opportunities for them to make a direct impact in their community. Several ideas are being considered including the development of a historic walking tour of the village center.
