Historic Architect Phillip Warbasse Visits the New Museum Location

In March of 2018 the Society board members invited Historic Architect Phillip Warbasse from Warbasse Associates to evaluate the house on Hastings Street.

Phillip was project manager for the restoration of the Olney Cook Artisan Shop located on Hartford Ave East in Mendon. He also evaluated the Gaskill – Pond farmhouse at 34 George Street to advise on restoration goals for that building.

Mr. Warbasse joined us for a tour of the Metcalf home where he helped us understand the original footprint of the house and the historic features that have been retained throughout the years.

With his expertise we were able to develop a comprehensive plan for making needed changes to the building while retaining the unique historic features.
